ATLANTA – Georgia DOT’s Information Technology department has proven itself one of the best in the nation; receiving an honorable mention award from The Urban and Regional Information Systems Association. The Department’s Transportation Explorer application (TREX) was selected by URISA in conjunction with its Exemplary Systems in Government Awards, which recognize improvement in the quality and delivery of government services.

“This award symbolizes the accomplishments we have made in the field of information technology as a department,” said Geographic Information Systems Manager Teague Buchanan.

TREX is a web portal system that serves as an internal information clearinghouse and also allows the public to search GDOT maps, reports and plans about all transportation projects in Georgia. Real time queries are run by city, state, or project number and the reports can be saved and printed.

“It is a privilege to receive this prestigious national award for TREX because this application was developed entirely by GDOT employees,” said Buchanan.
